Those who knew us last year will find this year's catalog of events considerably expanded. In 2004 we started off with our speakers' series and one workshop, working in collaboration with Hull Lifesaving Museum and Duxbury Bay Maritime School. Between 30 and 60 people attended each of our talks, and our half-model class was overbooked. There seems to be plenty of interest, and with our expanded collaboration with our likeminded friends at Hull Lifesaving Museum we're seeking to serve it.

We're continuing our speakers' series. Same as last year, the speakers are highly-regarded artisans with national and international reputations living and working right in our area. This year, we've supplemented that speakers' series with an array of workshops. There are three boatbuilding and boat design project workshops. These take place a weekday evening or two and run several weeks. We are also offering an array of Saturday afternoon workshops and demonstrations that cover skills and information vital to boatbuilders and boat owners.

Our events are useful to general boat nuts as well as to professional builders looking to expand their knowledge and to get to know the expertise available in the area. The artisans we're working with are chosen for their expertise, but we're also lucky that these folks tend to be excellent speakers and instructors. Our form of pedagogy is not to simplify the subjects, but to convey the principles that are needed for an intuitive understanding of the work. Boatbuilding is intellectually and conceptually demanding, and that's why it's so darn interesting.

We're excited about our collaboration with Hull Lifesaving Museum. They have decades of experience training people in their boatshops in Hull and South Boston, and they have an office with dedicated people who will help us coordinate our effort. Hopefully, more institutions and artisans will come on board and our series and will consist of events all along coastal Massachusetts in the coming years.

Special thanks to our sponsors who have advertised in this catalog. Please take note of these people and turn to them when you can. Also, thanks to the Massachusetts Charitable Mechanic Association who have come through with another grant for tools. The shop is really taking shape!

Our project workshops represent a real opportunity for people to have a genuine shop experience, with lots of hands-on learning mixed with free and far-reaching discussion about the work at hand. These workshops generally take place one or two evenings a week, and run several weeks.

As well as the three courses listed here, others will be offered in the near future—the half-model class is especially popular. Some courses are geared for the rank novice—such as Build the Tommy Cod—while others are geared for people with a little more experience.

All the courses allow students enough time to familiarize themselves with the tools, thought processes, methods, and materials necessary for successful boat building, restoring, and owning.

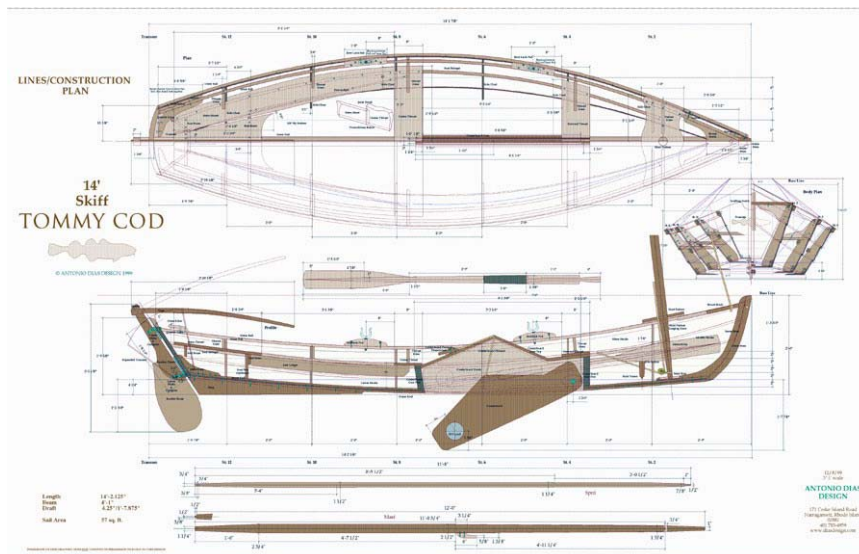
Build the Tommy Cod

Date: Tuesday and Wednesday evenings 5:30-9:30PM, October 12-November 6, 2005

Instructor: Reuben Smith

Come to Jones River Landing to build Tommy Cod, a 14' rowing, sailing dory/skiff from the board of local designer Antonio Dias. Tease out a dream boat design with the help of dream boat designer Antonio Dias. Preconceptions about layout, rig, and hullform will be weighed against the realities of construction, cost, and performance. Dias's book, *Designer and Client*, will be the text of the course, and students will learn about the push and pull that goes on between a designer and client. The workshop will be in largely seminar form, with students working up cartoon renditions of boats they design, and then refining them through the course of the workshop. Selecting and Using Locally Milled Lumber in Boats

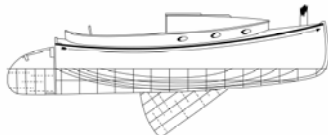

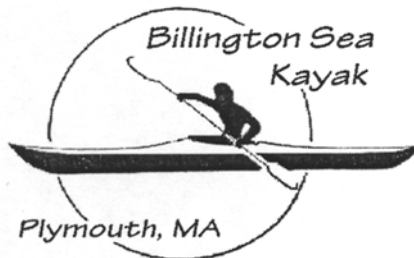
